	Any physical location in which a crime has occurred or is suspected of having occurred.
	Crime Scene: The original location of a crime or accident
	Crime Scene: An alternate location where additional evidence may be found.
	Second person associated with committing a crime.
	Statement of where a suspect was at the time of a crime.
Types of Evidence	
	evidence would be any witnessed accounts of an incident or crime.
	evidence would refer to any material items that are present at the crime scene or on the victims.
	evidence refers evidence that is found at a crime scene in small but measurable amounts.

_____ interview witnesses and consult with the CSI unit. They investigate the crime by following leads provided by witnesses and physical evidence.
